Life of a Football Official

- We do it for the love of the game, the constant challenge...and appreciate that we get compensated financially.
- Pre-season: clinics, meetings, rules study
 - Scrimmages
 - Get in shape! Heat acclimation
- In-season: rules study, meetings, games!
 - Monday: New Member Meetings
 - Tuesday-Thursday: Subvarsity games (assigned or self-assigned)
 - Friday: Chains, clock, or even on-field for varsity games





Starting out

- Be patient don't give up!
- Take notes
- Use your mentor
- Don't give up









Shirts (must be TASO-approved)

- "Placard" position letter on the back
- "Sublimated" not a patch, actually transfers the dye on the shirt

Long-sleeve – you'll need it eventually

 When it gets to that time of year, BRING BOTH!





Pants (with white seams)

Chain assignments, varsity assignments

Shorts (black shorts with white side seams)

Authorized for scrimmages and sub-varsity assignments





Undershirt/undershorts... crucial!

Black is required



Socks

- With shorts, ankle-length preferred (but not necessarily required – compression socks, calf sleeves if black)
- With pants, at least crew-length preferred
 - Try compression?



Belt – black leather

Can be the shiny kind ("patent leather") or matte kind







- Can have some white but must be mostly black
- Cleats, no cleats, "turf cleats"





Black hat with white piping

You will not need a white hat



Whistle and lanyard – pealess

- Most popular Fox 40
- Multiple styles of lanyard extra long, adjustable, breakaway
- Finger whistle...if you do your signals right!











Down indicator



Chain clip

Watch – many varieties (dual-function count up/down soccer watches work great, but so will a \$10 Timex)



Bean bag – black and white are the only TASO-approved bags









Flipping coin (or quarter)





Equipment – chain crew



Black hat

White polo

Belt

Black pants

Black shoes

Chain clip

In your bag...everything else!

- Clipboard
- Extra paper/utensils
- The rest of your full uniform in case you need to hop in



Other uniform considerations

- Subvarsity and chain assignments come dressed
 - Most will come "half-dressed" for driving comfort and complete the ensemble in the parking lot
- Varsity games: 1.5 2 hours before kickoff, dress in locker room
 - Some exceptions for facilities without adequate space
- Bags
 - Many varsity officials use small-medium roller suitcases to carry their gear
 - For subvarsity games I will pack a duffel bag


Some other locations where you may find other accessories you like:


- <u>Smitty Outlet Store</u> (defective or discontinued products at your own risk, sometimes can get very cheap deals look closely though and ask us if you have questions

 They don't sell TASO shirts but have other football items)

Most of these places have efficient shipping, so you can wait a couple of weeks before you need to get on the ball. Be wary of the starter packs - sometimes it comes with too much or too narrow of a selection. Start small with the necessities and build as you figure out what you like and see what other officials have.





"What if"?


Rules tests are effective ways to stay sharp!

- Challenge yourself to answer "closed book" and then check your answers
- Come up with your own scenarios

Format: Team, Down/Distance, Line of Scrimmage, clock status

Q: A 1/10 @ A-35 with the clock running. Prior to the snap, tackle A74 jumps up to start blocking. Defensive tackle B99 subsequently runs across the neutral zone.

A: A 1/15 @ A-30, ready-for-play.
